MEDICA 2018 under the spell of digitisation

Top medical event, unique variety of topics and offers, internationality at the highest level – there are many reasons why it is a must for the global health industry to come to MEDICA in tens of thousands. But above all, the no. 1 trade fair is the only event in the world that provides a reliable overview of all the latest developments. 





At COMPAMED, everyone who wants to know how in the future medicine could care for people will get a glimpse of tomorrow's world. Due to the fact that the highly innovative supplier industry is reacting to the demands of modern times with tailor-made high-tech solutions, the international no. 1 trade fair has established itself as a driving force, impetus and source of ideas for the healthcare industry. In 2018, 784 exhibitors from 40 countries gathered in two exhibition halls and presented their innovations to 20,000 trade visitors – with a clearly recognisable tendency: The trend towards miniaturisation is continuing. The profiteer is the medical technology industry, which is always on the lookout for smart and tiny components for new medical products.

Microsystems and sensors, active implants, special adhesives, linear technology, packaging, high-tech mechanical engineering and 3D printing provided incentives for innovative solutions across the board. These developments provide an insight: A small sensor system for non-invasive blood pressure monitoring in the ear, special microsystems that can stimulate diseased tissue attached to endoscopes or a mobile compact device for the rapid diagnosis of blood that is compatible with sample carriers of all common manufacturers.


